CGO



Capt. Michael Kraft, the chief of hospital services at the 920th Aerospace Medicine Squadron, Joint Base Langley-Eustis, Va., was named the **920th Rescue Wing's Company Grade Officer of the Year for 2016**. Kraft provided 548 medical evaluations and ensured more than 700 Reservists were deployment and mission ready. In addition, he managed nearly a dozen line-of-duty cases and two medical boards, and reviewed 20 waivers and 367 profiles. Under his leadership, the squadron's patient capacity doubled, and customer satisfaction ratings increased to 99 percent. Outside his Air Force Reserve career, Kraft completed a one-year sports medicine residency and as a subject matter expert taught 129 medical residents and students from three different medicine specialty programs. He also published a case presentation in a nationally recognized journal.

Senior NCO



Master Sgt. Brent Burch, a pararescueman at the 308th Rescue Squadron, Patrick Air Force Base, Fla., was named the **920th Rescue Wing's Senior Noncommissioned Officer of the Year for 2016**. Burch enabled more than 350 training events and was selected as the squadron's logistics superintendent. He facilitated a manpower study of more than 1,000 tasks across 12 Air Force Specialty Codes and collected vital data for Air Force Reserve Command. Burch also developed new equipment standards processes for Guardian Angels operators, purchasing approximately 2,000 items and ensuring personnel were 100 percent equipped. As a Citizen Airman, Burch pursued a bachelor's degree in sports and health management and volunteered as a youth soccer coach. He is also assisted with the 920th Rescue Wing's Family Day and started a family beach cleanup program in his community.

NCO



Tech. Sgt. Allison Williams, an immunization backup technician at the 920th Aerospace Medicine Squadron, Joint Base Langley-Eustis, Va., was named the **920th Rescue Wing's Noncommissioned Officer of the Year for 2016**. Williams conducted training and maintained 717 shot records for eight geographically separated units. In addition, she managed the government travel card program and infection control program, led infection control and safety inspections, and jumpstarted the unit's flu shot program. Williams assisted or administered more than 17,000 immunizations during 2016 and mentored another medical technician. While serving as a Citizen Airman, Williams earned 32 credit hours toward her bachelor's degree in nursing and completed emergency medical technician refresher and basic life support courses.

Airman



Staff Sgt. Calvin Fleming, a health services management technician at the 920th Aerospace Medicine Squadron, Joint Base Langley-Eustis, Va., was named the **920th Rescue Wing's Airman of the Year for 2016**. Fleming maintained more than 1,200 medical and dental records and directly supported pre- and post-deployment medical evaluations for 717 reservists from eight geographically separated units. He provided on-the-job training for two new personnel and helped facilitate more than 500 physical exams. As a Citizen Airman, Fleming pursued a project management degree and coached male youth recreation sports. He also earned 6 credits toward his Community College of the Air Force degree, served as the unit safety representative, and raised more than \$6,500 for charity. (Note: Fleming was a senior airman for most of 2016, and was recently promoted to the NCO rank).

1st Sergeant



Master Sgt. Jamie Stubbs, the first sergeant for the 301st Rescue Squadron, Patrick Air Force Base, Fla., was named the **920th Rescue Wing's First Sergeant of the Year for 2016**. As the unit's enlisted advisor, he oversaw the morale, health, well-being, discipline and professional development of 75 rescue warriors. Stubbs streamlined the squadron's Family Care Program while enhancing its Key Spouse Program. He was also recognized for his efforts in spearheading an enlisted performance report workshop for 40 Airmen and revamping the squadron's EPR process to ensure a thorough quality review process and 100 percent unit compliance. He instituted the 2016 First Sergeant Mentoring Program and facilitated a First Sergeant Symposium. Stubbs earned his third Community College of the Air Force degree and completed 62 credit hours toward an associate degree in Sports Management.
